



## Dalby region to get top negotiation tips

AgForce Projects' CSG team will be returning to the Dalby region next week for the fifth time in a year to deliver much-needed CSG negotiation support to landholders.

Workshops will be held in Dalby on 23 July and Miles on 24 July.

AgForce Projects CSG project officer Natalie Pears said with the industry continuing to expand in the region, landholders need access to independent information and support more than ever.

"We continue to get requests to return to the region to deliver this information, which is a clear sign that more and more landholders are being impacted by this industry," Ms Pears said.

"CSG is a serious issue for landholders in this region and we want to make sure they are aware of their rights and understand how to exercise those rights in order to protect their farming enterprise."

Ms Pears said the negotiation support workshops will give landholders the tools they need to achieve a fair conduct and compensation agreement (CCA).

"Dealing with a CSG company can be very daunting and like most Queenslanders, primary producers don't have extensive legal knowledge or negotiation experience," Ms Pears said.

"This series of information sessions is about arming landholders with the best set of tools going into negotiations. We will give landholders the information they need to help assess the potential impacts of CSG activity on their property, provide detailed negotiation tips and help landholders prepare property information to use when negotiating a CCA.
