### West Queensland graziers get help to combat wild dogs

Producers and graziers in Western Queensland will get the opportunity to access free wild dog control and trapping workshops when AgForce Projects heads to the region in June.

AgForce Projects vertebrate pest management officer Damien Ferguson said providing free and practical workshops is vital to producers.

“Wild dogs are a significant issue across Queensland and this is the first time our workshops have visited this far west. We are encouraging all landholders to come along,” Mr Ferguson said.

“These workshops provide producers with practical, hands-on skills that are needed to control the spread of wild dogs and other feral pests across the landscape.”

The workshops will include trapping and baiting demonstrations, as well as how to identify wild dog activity.

They are also a great opportunity for producers form local wild dog committees to work with councils and coordinate approaches to wild dog control and management.
